New This Year! Online-Onsite Registration!

Starting October 2, 2019, through November 21, 2019, attendees can register themselves online for the Annual Conference. This is an online self-registration process at the onsite registration cost. This process eliminates filling out a registration card onsite and allows the registrant to go directly to a dedicated Online Onsite Self-Registration Payment Counter upon arrival, where the registrant will pay for their badge and have it printed. No badges will be mailed or payments accepted in NJLM office for this type of registration.

Payment is due onsite. We accept cash, check, money order, or purchase order. We do not accept credit cards. Using this process will improve accuracy and require the registrant to spend less time at the onsite registration.

In order to expedite the CEU Tracking process, the League will have badge scanning in every classroom at the Atlantic City Convention Center. All attendees looking to earn CEUs must follow the process mentioned below.

For Sessions with CEUs:

- There will be no CEU Volunteers present at the doors. Instead attendees will self-scan in and out. Desktop Scanners will be present at the entrance of each room.
- Following the conference, the attendees will log on to the Tracking System website and download their CEUs the same way they have done in previous years.

All ATTENDEES scanning for credit MUST self-scan in and out. This is a requirement of all accrediting bodies to receive CEUs.
