Important City Facilities Access Update

New Brunswick, NJ (March 13, 2020) - In response to the current COVID-19 outbreak, the following safeguards have been put into place. These measures will help to not only reduce and minimize the spread of COVID-19, but will help maintain an environment of safety for visitors, residents and City employees.

Beginning Monday March 16 and continuing through Friday March 20, general public access to City Hall and Civic Square will be restricted to those with scheduled appointments. Visitors will be required to check in upon arrival.

Those wishing to make in-person tax or water and sewer payments will have access to a secure lock box located inside the rear entrance of City Hall. For those seeking to file applications with or making payments to Construction Code, Engineering, Inspections, Planning and Economic Development, a secure lock box will be located inside the rear entrance of Civic Square. Appointments are not required to make these payments. Cash will NOT be accepted for lock box payments. Money orders or checks ONLY.

The Health and Vital Statistics office in Civic Square will continue to operate as normal.

All operations of the New Brunswick Police Department located at 25 Kirkpatrick Street will continue to operate on their regular schedule.

City Hall and Civic Square will continue to be fully staffed and operational during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m. through 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Residents are encouraged to conduct business with the City electronically or by phone. Many City forms and documents are available for download at the City website (cityofnewbrunswick.org).

The New Brunswick Free Public Library is currently operating under normal hours at reduced occupancy. Those not wishing to visit the library can access it remotely. Call the library at (732) 745-5108 or visit the library website (nbpfl.org) for more information about gaining remote access, meeting usage, and upcoming programming.

The Senior Resource Center will be closed beginning Monday March 16 through Friday April 3. All activities, programs, and trips are suspended. The Senior Resource Center staff will be available to answer questions and address concerns weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at 732-745-5100.

All New Brunswick Municipal Court sessions are cancelled for the week of March 16.

The HUB Teen Center is closed from Monday March 16 through Friday April 3. All programs and community meetings have been cancelled.

New Brunswick Dial-A-Ride Service is suspended until further notice.

Further information regarding public meetings will be provided during the week of March 16.

During the week this policy is in place, the City will develop a strategy to restore the ready access that the public has enjoyed throughout the years while providing the necessary safeguards to reduce the potential exposure to COVID-19 for visitors and employees of City Hall and Civic Square.
